Welcome to the Kids Early Years Network (KEYS)

The KEYS Network aims to improve the way that government and community organisations support Aboriginal families with children from 0-5 years across Western Sydney.

We recognise that the best place for Aboriginal children to be is at home with their family. There are times however, when families need some extra support to meet life's challenges. The KEYS Network wants to make it easier for Aboriginal parents and carers to ensure you get access to the right supports at the right time. This means less time trying to find support and more time focusing on your family.

How the KEYS Network can help:



Easier access to services means Aboriginal families will thrive

KEYS removes the stress of accessing multiple services. If you need timely access to services like housing or counselling, KEYS can coordinate this for you. This can include connecting you to culturally safe services.



A whole-of family approach

KEYS recognises the family unit is central for Aboriginal people. The needs of the child and family are therefore at the heart of KEYS. Each member of your family will identify their own goals which means that families can go on the KEYS journey together.



One trusted contact

KEYS believes that services can share information in a respectful and secure way to ensure that you only need to share your story once.



Respect and choice

KEYS is designed to help Aboriginal families live happy and healthy lives. You choose what services your family uses. The KEYS Network is voluntary which means that you can withdraw from KEYS at any time.

KEYS is available to vulnerable families with a child 0 – 5 years of age.

A service provider such as a GP or teacher acts as the primary contact to assess the family's suitability and gain consent to refer them to KEYS.

Goals for each family member are developed with the family and their preferred point of contact.

KEYS team links family information and services safely to better meet the holistic needs of the family.

KEYS team and services continue to work together to support families to achieve their goals.



How KEYS Network works:



Joining KEYS

If you would benefit from the KEYS Network, your family can be introduced through a service provider, such as a community support worker, teacher, or someone else in your community who you trust. You can also refer your family.



Connecting services

The KEYS Network includes Aboriginal staff who will work with your service providers and help to organise your access to services such as health care, cultural support, and education providers.



Setting your goals

Every member in your family will outline strengths, needs and goals that will be included in a plan for your family. This plan will be used to coordinate services to best support your family.



Respecting your information

KEYS takes the protection of your personal information seriously. Data is stored securely, is protected by State and Federal legislation and is only shared with relevant services where it relates to the safety and wellbeing of your family.
